Frequently asked questions

Can my child attend Nursery or school if they are not toilet trained?

Yes they can. The school has highly experienced staff who can support you to successfully toilet train your child. There are toilet areas specifically for Nursery and Reception to make it easy for your child to go to the toilet wherever they are in Nursery.

Can my child attend additional sessions before and after their Nursery or school session?

Yes **all** children can attend Breakfast Club from 8am and After School Care until 5pm.

What experience do your staff have of working with young children?

All classes **including the Nursery** have a qualified teacher who with many years' experience of working with young children. The teacher is always supported by other suitably qualified staff.

What if my child has Special Needs?

If your child has any additional needs the class teacher is supported by the SENCo – Miss Lumsden to put a Support Plan in place. The school also employs an Educational Psychologist as well as working with other professionals from Health, including, Speech & Language to support your child.

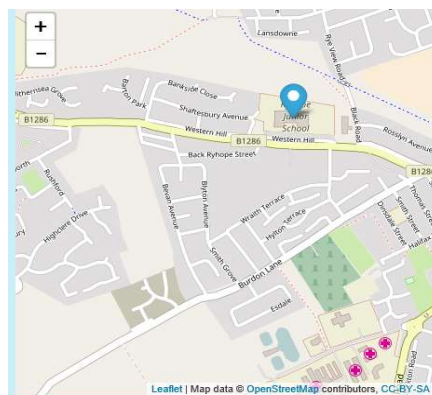

Extended Services

Manager – Mrs K Cummings

Breakfast Club for 3-7 year olds: (in the school hall)

3 and 4 year old Nursery children from:
8-00am to 8-30am.

£2.50 for breakfast and care

4 -7 year olds (Reception-Year 2) from:
8-00am to 8-50am.

£3.50 for breakfast and care

After School Care: (in the Nursery Studio)

3-7 year olds from:
3-15pm until **5-00pm.**

£4.50 for a light snack and care.

Children attending After School Care have a light snack/tea, which are planned for as part of a Healthy Eating Programme.

Nursery lunches:

11.30-12.30 for children attending for 2 ½ days at a cost of **£6.00** (£2.00 for lunch & £4.00 for care) per day £12.00 per week.

Children have their lunch in the nursery setting with dedicated lunchtime assistants. Menus are available from Mrs Cummings and dietary needs can be discussed before your child starts lunches.

Additional sessional care for Nursery children over and above their 15 hour entitlement at a cost of £12.00 per session can be arranged following a discussion with Mrs Cummings.
