

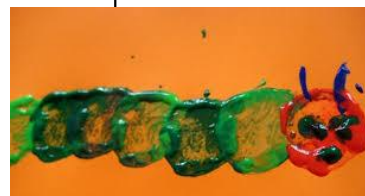
Read the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar.' Or watch the animated version on YouTube.

Go for a walk or explore your garden. Can you spot a butterfly? Can you find any other minibeasts?



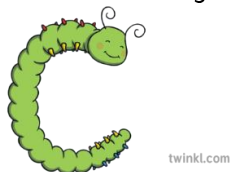
Make a potato print caterpillar. Cut potatoes in half, dip them in paint and create a caterpillar.

How many things you can find that begin with c?

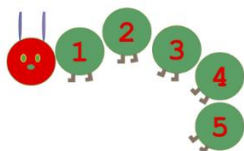
A grown up might give you some clues e.g. something that you eat / something that you wear.



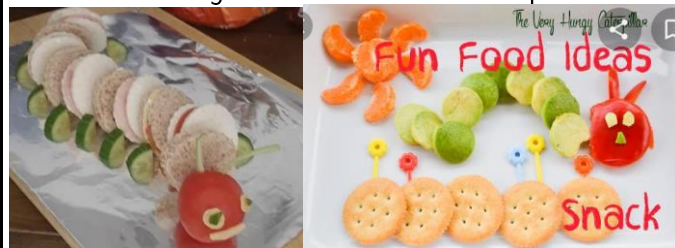
Draw a picture of a healthy meal on a paper plate (if you don't have a paper plate just use paper).



Play 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' number match game (The game is available to print from our blog or make your own by drawing 2 caterpillars and cut out circles of paper). Take turns to roll a dice and find the circle with the same number. Who can complete their caterpillar first?



Make some caterpillar snacks by cutting sandwiches into circle shapes or using crackers, fruit and vegetable sticks. Talk about the shapes and count how many circles are on the caterpillar.
