Your booklet will need a title- make it bold and bright! You will also need to draw an illustration on the front cover and don't forget to write your name, because you are the author!</p>	<p>Pick a number between 1-30. Write it in words, how many tens and ones, what is one more/one less? Can you make up a sentence for each word and write it down.</p>	<p>History: A long time ago, knights used to wear metal armour to protect themselves in battle. Because the armour covered their faces, no-one knew who was inside it! To stop each other from attacking a friend, they would have a "coat of arms" on their shield. This was a design that showed which family they belonged to. Can you design a coat of arms for your family? Tuesday	<p>Think about the information you want to share in your booklet. Today, can you make a contents page? Remember, the contents has the same "subheadings" that you will write on your information pages. You will also need to put the page numbers next to your subheadings, so you know which page to find each piece of information. Decide what information you would like to write about on each page, thinking about the parts of the castle that you find interesting.</p>	<p>Can you recall the number bonds to 10?</p> <p>Quartering shapes: You could watch this or talk about quarters. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/roi-n-5170-halves-and-quarters-powerpoint Make a square. Fold it and fold it again so it has 4 parts. Each part is a quarter. Repeat this with different shapes. There is an activity you could look at/print. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-n-5440-is-it-a-quarter-activity-sheet-</p>	<p>Today's digraph is: ew Ask a grown up to write a mixture of words for you including ew (dew pew blew new few plew flew bew tew)</p> <p>Can you sort them into real and nonsense words?</p>	<p>Science: We see lots of different types of flowers and plants in the garden and all around us outdoors. Some of these we can eat! We call these edible plants, fruits and vegetables. Can you make a list of as many different plants that we can eat, and then sort them into 2 groups: fruit and vegetables. Choose your favourites, draw a circle as a plate, and then draw and colour a healthy meal including your favourite vegetables. Do the same for "dessert" with some fruit.</p>
Wednesday	<p>Using your contents page, write your first "subheading". Make it big and bold, so that it stands out! Write some information underneath, and draw an illustration to match. You might even want to put some labels on your illustration. Remember to write carefully, thinking about the shape of your letters, with lead in's and hook out's. Make some marks on the ground, and see if you can aim a ball/ bean bag/ pair of rolled up socks to hit the marks. Think about how much power you need to use to reach your target.
