


Clever Clogs: Sequence the pictures from the story and write a simple retell which includes a beginning/ middle/ ending. Remember about letter shapes, capital letters to begin a new sentence, finger spaces and full stops.

Brainboxes/Bright Sparks: Sequence the pictures from the story and use them to verbally retell the story to an adult. Your grown-up will write your verbal responses. "Have a go" yourself, with the help of your adult, to write 3 simple sentences using your knowledge of phonics/ HFW/ Tricky words to tell a beginning/ middle/ end.

If you are unable to stick the pictures on to the sheet, number them in order when you return them to work and we will stick them for you.

Smarty Pants/Whizz Kids: Complete the discussion questions on squared paper.

Task: To read the comprehension and answer questions

Smarty Pants: Read the comprehension story to a grown up, with support for tricky

Objective: Subtraction not crossing 10 (practical activity)

What happens when we subtract zero? Did you remember that the number does not change?

Today we are going to follow the first, then, now model. How many objects are there at first, then what happened, now how many are there?

Geography: Look again at your globe/map of the world. Recap the terms North Pole, South Pole, Equator. Recap Meerkat Mail.

Where do **Meerkats** live? Use a globe, atlas, Google World to locate **Southern Africa**. See what you can find out about the **Kalahari Desert**. Look at the fact files for Meerkats, the Kalahari Desert and Desert habitats. How is a desert different to where we live?

Clever Clogs: Share the comprehension story with a grown-up, reading as much as you are able to yourself. It will be too tricky to read it all yourself, so your grown-up will read it with you. Answer the questions on your recording sheet.

Bright Sparks/ Brainboxes: Listen to the comprehension story read by your grown-up. Try to use your phonic knowledge/ knowledge of tricky and HFW to join in where you can. Your grown-up will then read the questions about the story to you, and help you to fill in the recording sheet.

e.g. **First** there were 16 biscuits on the plate, **then** the children ate 3 of them, **now** there are 13 of them.

Remember to take objects away when using practical objects and to cross out when using pictures.

All groups: Today you are going to collect 20 objects and practise telling subtraction number stories using **first**, **then**, **now**.

Task: Desert Habitat Facts

Smarty Pants/Whizz Kids: Sort the statements into 2 lists — desert habitats and non-desert habitats. Write a description of the main features of a desert habitat.

Clever Clogs: Sort the pictures into 2 groups — desert and non-desert. Write a simple caption about the main features of a desert habitat.

Bright Sparks/Brainboxes: Sort the pictures into 2 groups – desert and non-desert. Tell an adult your reasons for your choices.

Thursday

Recap the story together, talking about main characters, setting, events etc. How did Gaspar and Rossi feel at the end of the story? Did they feel different to the beginning? Will this change how they behave in the future?

Task:

Smarty Pants: Write a new chapter about Gaspar and Rossi. Give as much detail as possible, using descriptive sentences with connectives.

Objective: Subtraction not crossing 10 (written activity)

You can continue to use objects to help you and/or draw circles and cross them out.

Smarty Pants/Whizz Kids: Complete question 1-3.

Clever Clogs: Complete question 1-2.

Bright Spark and Brain Boxes: Complete the pictorial subtractions. **Remember to cross out pictures to help you.**

Did you notice a pattern?

Science: What do you remember about the animals from the Polar regions from last week? How do we keep warm in the winter in the UK? How do animals in the Polar regions keep warm, how are they suited to their environment? Look at the PowerPoint slides 'Arctic Animals'.

Task: Sort the pictures of the Polar animals by the body covering and how they keep warm. (Thick fur/oily skin/blubber/thick feathers).

Blubber is a thick layer of fat that helps to insulate (keep the body warm). Do you think blubber helps to keep the animals warmer? Let's find out with an investigation.

Clever Clogs: Write a new chapter about Gaspar and Rossi. Make sure that it has a beginning/ middle and end.

Bright Sparks/ Brainboxes: Draw a picture of Gaspar and Rossi showing what might happen next. With support write 3 simple sentences using knowledge of phonics/ HFW to tell a beginning/ middle/ end.

The tens number stays the same and you can simply subtract the ones numbers.

Investigation: Does blubber help to keep animals warmer? (see the attached investigation sheet)

This is what you would have been doing if you were in school today. If you are able to find the resources needed, have a go at it yourself. If you can't, write your prediction on the worksheet first, based on what you now know about Polar Animals. Once you have done that watch

Here are the instructions for the investigation if you are doing it yourself ⁽²⁾

All groups:

- 1) Write down your prediction on your sheet before you begin.
- 2) You will need a bowl of icy water, some lard, 2 plastic bags.
- 3) Put your hand in the water and time how long you can keep it in there. Record your time.
- 4) Now put the lard in bag 1, put your hand in bag 2 and put it inside bag 1, making sure that your hand is covered in lard.
- 5) Repeat step 3 and see how long you can keep your hand in the water this time. Record your time.

Did you manage to keep your hand in for a shorter or longer amount of time with the **blubber**? Complete your investigation sheet.

Remember to take pictures while you carry out your investigation.
