
#### Prepositions

A preposition is a word that tells you where or when something is in relation to something else. Examples of prepositions include words like after, before, on, under, inside and outside. The house was on the hill beside a tree. In this sentence 'on' and 'beside' are prepositions which show you exactly where the house wa

#### Science:

Recap habitats by playing the habitat game <a href="https://368.stem.org.uk/Human%20and%20Animal%20Habitats/page/modules/habitats2.html">https://368.stem.org.uk/Human%20and%20Animal%20Habitats/page/modules/habitats2.html</a>. This introduces chn to different habitats and what each animal needs to survive in each habitat

Recap Africa as a continent and locate where it is.

Discuss habitats within Africa such as the Savannah and habitats within England such as the Woodland.

Discuss why specific animals and plants would be best suited to each habitat.

Use heading for each animal and sentences to describe how they survive in their habitat.

An example of retell of this part using prepositions:

Jamina walked over the leaves then **through** the river towards the trees that sat behind the mist above the river. She looked **up** and could see birds flying **behind** the trees in the sunset sky. Behind the silhouette trees the sun was setting and reflecting on the river. The clouds drifted **in front** of the sun and the water ran through her toes and eventually she reached the African bush.

### Wednesday

An important skill in Year 2 is to re-draft and improve writing — evaluating own work and think about how it can be improved.

Today we would like you to re-draft what you wrote yesterday, when you used prepositions to retell part of a story however this time adding adjectives to describe. You could really challenge yourself and add similes, expanded noun phrases etc. All of the skills we have learned so far!

The third set of problems involve using money to buys toys and fruit and working out whether you need to add, subtract or multiply...

#### Art:

Show chn a range of African art including different techniques such as, oil paintings, sketches, pattern and pointillism.


Display examples of tribal masks and explore.

Ask chn what they can discuss about each tribal mask. What gives it a good effect?

Before you begin look carefully at the pictures and think of all the adjectives you could include — then write them into you retell.

Chn to create own tribal mask and design their own pointillism pattern to cover the front of the mask. Chn to cut out shape and holes for eyes when finished. (see resources)

Discuss what colours are being used and why? Why do they think this is most effective?









#### Thursday

### Negative and Positive Adjectives:

Adjectives are words that we use to describe. Often authors will use adjectives to help the reader understand how characters are feeling therefore will use dull/negative adjectives during some parts of stories e.g. dark, dingy, desperate. Moreover, they could use positive adjectives to help readers infer how characters are feeling e.g. beautiful, colourful, joyful.


Your first task is to sort the adjectives (on Thursday literacy resources into positive and negative).

On this picture Jamina is having a positive experience — she is happy and playing. Can you retell this part using positive adjectives?

### For example:

Jamina felt so excited, she couldn't wait to be a hunter! She played happily in the bright, colourful and amazing African bush. She heard a harmonising tweet from a joyful bird that flew beautifully around her. The soft, green grass ran through her tiny feet.


On this picture Jamina is having a negative experience — she has wandered too far into the bush and lost her grandfather.
